

# The Majma Dance Festival Survival Guide

Getting to Glastonbury:

Nearest Transport Links

Railway Station - Castle Cary - 9.1 miles (14.6km)

Motorway Junction - M5 Junction 23 - 11.4 miles (18.4km)

Airport - Bristol - 16.1 miles (25.9km)



Main location: St Dunstan's Community School and Arts College is located on Wells Road Glastonbury, Somerset, BA6 9BY.

Class locations: Classes will also be held at St Benedict's School, on Benedict Street, (the road running between the two coffee shops at the Market Cross. Glastonbury BA6 9EX).

St Margaret's Church and Town Hall are both located on Magdalene Street, Glastonbury, Somerset. BA6 9EL. St Margaret's is across the street and to the left of the Town Hall.

## Parking



Parking: There is a public car park next to the left of the Town Hall (confusingly called St Dunstan's Car Park). Access is best from the Glastonbury bypass (A39) Wirral Roundabout, third exit approaching from Street or first exit approaching from Wells.

Parking is also available at St Dunstan's School and there is public car parking at Butts Close Car Park which is situated within a few yards of the High Street on its northeast side (top of the high street). More parking can be found at Silver Street Car Park a few yards off the high street on its southeast side (top of High Street.)

Parking for St Benedicts can be found at Northload West Car Park, which has easy access from the Glastonbury bypass (A39) Beckery Roundabout. If full, car users should continue through the car park past the *Who'd a-thought it* public house and into St John's car park (only 100 yards away) which has plenty of space.

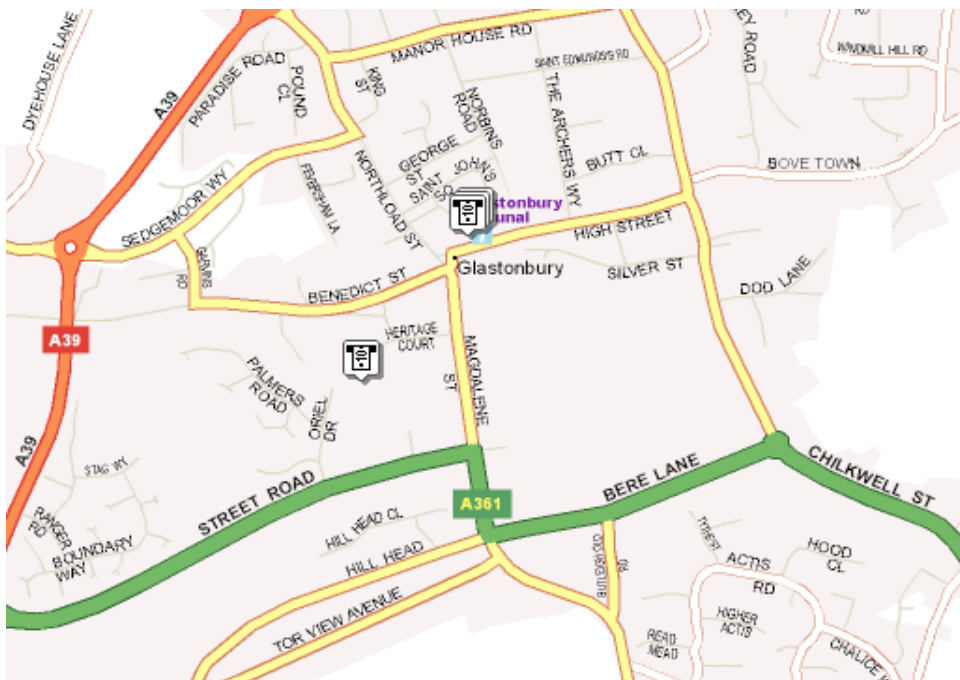

## Food:

Food is not provided at the Majma Dance Festival, but a choice of food stalls and vendors will be found in the main hall area, where you can select your favourite food and join friends and other dancers for a bite in the evening. Lunchtime baguettes for Saturday and Sunday can be ordered, and will be available at the café in St Dunstan's at 1.30pm on each day, please check at registration for details.

There is a selection of cafes and pubs in the centre of town, many of which serve vegan and vegetarian dishes. There is a Co-op supermarket at the top end of town and Morrisons (with restaurant) at the bottom of town behind St Margaret's Church.

## Cash machines:



There are several located in the town centre at banks such as HSBC, Lloyds, Barclays and Natwest.

### Workshops & Seminars:

Workshops must be booked in advanced, however as numbers will be limited, do book early to ensure your first choice of workshops.

Drumming classes can be booked on the day and private drumming classes can be booked with Chas Whitaker.

Zen Den Café and Video Lounge: Enjoy a coffee and cake, relax and watch videos or perhaps book a chair massage. (Details available in Zen Den Café)

### Festival times:

The event runs from Friday 5pm until Sunday 6pm.

Registration starts at 5pm on Friday. Majma ends with the Sunday Shimmy-On show, which starts at 5pm and ends around 6.30pm. The evening parties start after the show and will end at midnight.

Shopping: There will be a massive souk, which will be open during break time and in the evening from Friday until 2.30pm Sunday. There are also an array of unusual shops in Glastonbury.
